Wet Works Permit

Why have a Wet Works Permit? Water damage from non-weather-related events accounts for a high percentage of Builders Risk claims. Water damage caused by work on piping systems can be prevented with the proper controls. This permit is intended to be used as part of a comprehensive Water Intrusion/Mitigation plan. The permit includes a checklist and provides a means to document controls in place. A risk assessment of the wet work planned should be completed and signed before starting the work. Wet work can be described as an operation that introduces liquid inside a building envelope or has the potential for liquid damage. Typical wet work operations can include pressure testing pipe, initial filling of pipe systems, leak testing, tie-ins to existing pipe systems, and modifications to existing piping systems.
